

The National Human Rights Commission is mandated under the Protection of Human Rights Act, 1993 to protect and promote the human rights of all persons. In order to fulfill its mandate, the Commission performs several functions, including reviewing the safeguards provided by or under the Constitution or any law for the time being in force, for the protection of human rights and recommending measures for their effective implementation in the country.

2.) In accordance with the same, an Open House Discussion on 'Re-examining Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions: Creating Safer Campuses through Awareness, Accountability, and Action' was held on 25th August 2025 at Manav Adhikar Bhavan, New Delhi, under the chairpersonship of Justice V. Ramasubramanian, Hon'ble Chairperson, NHRC. A list of suggestions emanating from the discussion is enclosed herewith to take necessary action at your end.

3.) Further, on 25 July 2025, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of **Sukdeb Saha vs State of Andhra Pradesh** has also issued guidelines for safeguarding students' mental health and well-being in educational institutions. It is requested to advise all concerned to take necessary action in this matter.

Annex

Suggestions emanating from the Open House Discussion on 'Re-examining Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions: Creating Safer Campuses through Awareness, Accountability, and Action' are as follows:

- i. The Ministry of Education and State Education Boards may integrate a human rights perspective into school curricula.
- ii. There is a need for anti-ragging squads ensuring round-the-clock vigilance on the campus and hostels.
- iii. Every institution should establish an independent monitoring system, ensuring representation from SC/ ST communities in anti-ragging committees.
- iv. Closure of anti-ragging complaints must be carefully reviewed through a three-tier system: institutional cell, monitoring agency, and district-level committee. Final closure should only be approved after the victim provides a feedback/ satisfaction note confirming resolution.
